1. Minutes of the last meeting

2. Police Report

3. Cemex

Cemex held an information session at the steeple hall on the 7th of the month. It is estimated that about 20 members of the public visited the exhibition.

Renfrewshire Council have still not provided the Community Council with a copy of the original planning application (98/0967/PP) for the activity in the quarry. It was noted that this makes discussions about the new application difficult when reference is being made to this information.

The full planning application for the change in conditions is awaited.

4. Notice Board

5. Roads and traffic

The Chairman said he was pleased to see re-surfacing work in Church Street and Tandlehill Road and that some pavement work was taking place at the top of the village.

It was noted that some of the main roads around the village were in need of attention.

6. Christmas Lights

It is expected that the application will go to the LAC in September.

7. Village improvement projects

The members suggested that the gap site at the old Co-op, which had been identified for redevelopment, could be improved in the interim.

The spout well & the well in Well Road were again noted as in need of improvement and it was decided to create a sub-committee in the new year to look at the whole question of improving the village.
